FYI

Mr. Newton shared our School Closure Procedures recently through Swift Alert, and the potential for having a temporary virtual day when possible (on a snow day etc...). I wanted to share a little more info on how that would work for Elementary. If we were to have a virtual learning day, the state would still require us to track attendance twice (once in the a.m., and once p.m.). Our teachers would make an initial contact with each of their homeroom students/parents. Assignments in ELA and Math would be shared via a variety of platforms: remind, Google Classroom, Seesaw, or another way. In order to be counted as “in attendance”, contact would need to be made, and the assignments would need to be completed and turned in by the next school day. Teachers will communicate how this will be done for each assignment, and it may look different for each class and each assignment. If you are not able to access the assignment, teachers will provide an alternate way to complete/turn in the assignment. If we are able to complete assignments in this way, these days would not be required to be made up later in the school year like they have in the past. If a virtual day was needed, communication will come from the district, as well as myself via Swift Alert, and then teachers would make contact with you.
